

	PLL- Alternative to Placement	PLL Reentry from Residential
Target Population Served (Inclusionary Criteria)	<p>Youth, ages 10 -18, who are...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On Juvenile Probation or Child Welfare • High Risk for Residential Commitment, Detention, or Foster Care Placement • Repeat Technical or VOP (Violations of Probation) or CPS Report of Abuse/Neglect • Straight Up Conduct Disorders <p>AND/OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dual Diagnosis or Designed SED (Severely Emotionally Disturbed) with or without substance abuse. 	<p>Youth, ages 10 -18, who are...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Currently in residential treatment and will be returning back into community <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the foster care system and reunification with biological family is possible • Dual Diagnosis or primary conduct disorder with or without substance abuse
Primary Goals	Quickly and efficiency stabilize the family in the community using PLL to:(a) Stop VOP and Further Penetration into System, and (b) Prevent Residential or Foster Care Placement	Safely Transition Youth Back Into the Community Through High Parent and Community Involvement Before, During, and After Discharge or Reunification From Foster Care or Group Home
Average Length of Treatment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Typically 2 -3 months • 6 weeks of Group + 6 to 8 Family Therapy Sessions in Community • Additional Family Therapy Only If Signs of Relapse- In the Form of Tune-Ups 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Typically 6-7 months (3 to 4 months while youth in residential or foster care + <i>minimum</i> 3 months in aftercare or when reunification takes place. • 6 weeks of Group + 12 family therapy sessions and any tune-ups if necessary.
Delivery of Supervision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two- 2 hour phone supervision session per month • Video supervision required • 24/7 coverage not available unless there is an emergency 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Same • Same • Because these are high risk cases we are available 24/7 to answer case questions outside of regular supervision hours
Number of Youth or Families Per Team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 36 per team per calendar year- Each Team (1 Full Time Master's Level + 1 Part-Time Bachelors Level) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 30 youth per calendar year per team per calendar year – [longer service duration] Each Team (1 Full Time Master's Level + 1 Full -Time Bachelors Level)
Case Manager	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Part-Time Needed- Because of short treatment duration only need part-time (20 hours per week) -1 full time case manager can be split between 2 front-end team 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full Time Case Manager for Each Team Because of Longer Service Duration and Higher Risk Population
Cost Per Youth	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Estimate (depending on budget) = \$4,800 per youth includes all personnel costs overhead and PLL training, ongoing supervision, and research 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Estimate (depending on budget) = \$6,500 per youth includes all personnel costs overhead and PLL training, ongoing supervision, and research [lower number per youth + longer service duration]
